


The mission of Manatee High School is to increase student engagement by providing opportunities to think in every classroom, every period, every day.

Graduation Requirements

- ✓ Earn 24 credits as follows:
 - 4 English
 - 4 Math (must include Algebra 1 and Geometry)
 - 3 Science (must include Biology)
 - 3.5 Social Studies (World History, Personal Finance and Money Management, US History, US Government, and Economics)
 - 1 HOPE (Health and PE)
 - 1 Fine Art/Practical Art with Artistic Content
 - 7.5 Elective Credits
- ✓ Earn an unweighted cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher
- ✓ Pass the required state assessments (Grade 10 FAST ELA & Algebra 1 EOC)

Fine Art/Practical Art Requirement

- All students must earn a Fine Art/Practical Art credit for graduation

HOPE Waiver

A student can waive the HOPE requirement in one of two ways:

1. Participate in two seasons of an interscholastic sport at the Junior Varsity or Varsity level

2. Complete two years of JROTC. This will waive the full credit in HOPE and the full credit in Fine Arts.





SPANISH

Spanish I For students enrolled in a world language (or Spanish) class for the first time

Prerequisite: B+ in Math and English; Proficient Score on ELA State Assessment

Spanish II For students who have completed Spanish I or heritage learners who have demonstrated mastery of Spanish I writing and reading skills.

Prerequisite: C+ in Spanish I

Spanish III Honors For students who have completed Spanish II or heritage learners who have demonstrated mastery of Spanish II writing and reading skills.

Prerequisite: C+ in Spanish I

Choosing Electives

- Rank your elective choices from 1-5.
 - If you choosing a program/academy, your #1 elective choice must fall within those elective choices.
 - Your #2-5 choices should be clearly ranked and can be any elective course.
- Carefully select elective courses. It is possible to get your 5th choice elective.
 Please make sure you will be happy with any course you choose on your request form.
- Certain elective courses require acceptance or recommendation.

What is a Prerequisite?

- If a course has a prerequisite, that means you must complete a specific course or have earned a minimum grade in previous coursework prior to being permitted to enroll in the class.
- Prerequisites for MHS courses are listed with the course description in the curriculum guide (on the MHS website).
- Example:

Spanish I 0708340 Grades 9 - 11

Prerequisite: Proficient Score on ELA State Assessment

Students are introduced to the language and culture of the Spanish-speaking world. Listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills are practiced daily. Essentials of grammar and sentence structure are stressed.

Schedule Changes

- Requests for schedule changes will ONLY be considered for the following reasons:
 - The student has already earned credit for the course
 - The student has failed to meet the prerequisite for the course
 - The student is schedules for too many or not enough courses
 - If there was a clerical error

Course Failure Policy

- If a student has been unsuccessful in a course, they will not be scheduled back into that course at MHS.
- Grade forgiveness is available only for earning a C, D, or F in middle school or a D or F in high school

State Universities of Florida

Admission into Florida's public universities is **competitive**. Minimum Admissions Requirements:

- ✓ Standard High School Diploma and ACT/SAT Scores
- ✓ 18 credits in college preparatory courses:
 - ✓ 4 English Credits
 - ✓ 4 Math Credits (Algebra 2 or higher level)
 - ✓ 3 Credits Science (2 with substantial labs)
 - ✓ 3 Credits Social Studies
 - ✓ 2 Credits Foreign Language (sequential in same language)
 - ✓ 2 Credits Academic Electives

Acceleration Options

Advanced Placement


- AP courses are college-level courses taught at the high school culminating in a national AP exam taking in May.
- Students interested in AP courses must have teacher approval
- AP summer assignments must be completed and submitted on the first day of school. Check school website for summer assignments (Schoology)
- Required to take the end of the year AP Exam
- Freshmen are permitted to take AP Human Geography if accepted into CPA

Dual Enrollment

- Dual enrollment is a program that allows eligible students to enroll in State College of Florida (SCF) courses or University of South Florida (USF) courses
- Credits earned are included in both the high school and college GPA
- Grades earned in dual enrollment courses become a permanent record on the college transcript
- DE courses are typically completed in grades 10-12

Athletics Requirements

- Must have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.0 to participate
- Compliance with FHSAA paperwork
 - EL-2 and EL-3 paperwork is located on our school website and at www.fhsaa.com
- Participating in athletics and activities is a privilege. In order to represent MHS, student conduct must be outstanding.
- Any student that owes money, textbooks, or school property may NOT
 participate in extracurricular activities until the debt is paid or the property is
 returned to the school. This includes clubs, sports, graduation, etc.

Return Forms to Middle Schools

Q: I don't attend one of your feeder middle schools, how do I register and select courses?

A: Visit the MHS website to obtain appropriate forms. Once you have completed the forms, send them to the appropriate counselor (by last name) or drop them off at the front desk.

Q: Can I pick up my schedule before school starts?

A: Official schedules are given out on the first day of school.

Q: Can I change a class at the end of the first semester?

A: No, your schedule will remain the same for the entire year.

Q: What if there is an error on my schedule?

A: Students can speak with their counselor after the first day of school. We will communicate the process in the fall.

Q: Can I take a foreign language as a 9th grader?

A: The course may be requested but, due to limited space the course may not be available until 10th grade.

Please note: If you successfully completed foreign language credit(s) in middle school and you select the next level, you will be guaranteed this elective.


Q: How many community service hours do I need for graduation?

A: Although hours may be required for scholarships or college admission, there is no community service requirement for graduation.

Please note: Hours completed in the summer after 8th grade can count. Community Service forms are available on our website.
