

Safety Patrols: Morning and Afternoon

Safety patrols lead the school by being responsible, respectful, and safe role models. Some of their duties include assisting staff during morning arrival by welcoming students at car riders, walking students to class, and monitoring hallways. They also help staff prepare for a fast and efficient dismissal by ensuring students get to their dismissal zone at the end of the day and monitoring dismissal areas to guarantee all students are safe.

Coaches Crew: Morning
