## **Message from the Principal**

Dear BRE families,

Spring is approaching and we find ourselves in a unique position as school will be starting back via the internet and online learning. This is a time like no other in our country and world. Let us not under play the importance of all this as we start back on March 30th.

You might be thinking about creating a minute by minute schedule for your kids. You might have high hopes of hours of learning, including online activities, science experiments, book reports, and teacher lead learning. The reality for some of our kids is that they are as scared as we are right now. Our kids see things and can hear everything that is going on around them, they can also feel our constant tension and possible anxiety. None of them have experienced anything like this before.

Over the coming weeks the idea of being off from school will move from sounding awesome to becoming a reality of feeling trapped at home and not seeing their friends. Over the coming weeks, you might see an increase in behavior issues within our kids. Whether it is anxiety, anger, or protest that they have to do learning on-line, or maybe just because things are not normal. You may see meltdowns, tantrums, and oppositional behavior this is normal and expected under these circumstances.

What kids need right now is to feel comforted and loved. They need to be able to talk and be heard. That might mean you have to tear up the idea of a perfect schedule and just love on your kids a bit. Here are some ideas that can show these in action:

- Play outside with them or go on a walk with them.
- Bake cookies or paint a picture
- Play board games and watch movies.
- Do science experiments together or take a virtual field trip to a unique location.
- Start reading a book together as a family, or start a family story together.
- Just snuggle under a blanket with nothing to do but talk and laugh.

Yes, school assignments will be on-line and there to do. You can support that work the best you can while you juggle your work, worry, and carry on with other items that are on your plate. Don't worry about your kids falling behind or regressing in school. Every kid across the country is in this same boat, and we will get through it and it will be ok. When school returns the teachers and professionals will course correct and meet your child's needs. This is what teachers are experts in doing!

Communicate with the teacher and school if your child is resisting doing math. Don't scream at your kids for not following the schedule. I would suggest not mandating 2 hours of constant working online on school work. This is going to be fluid process where the teachers need to hear from you on how things are going.

If I can leave you with one thing as we venture into this on-line learning together. Your child's mental health will be way more important than their academic skills. This will go back to how they felt during this time, and the support we provided during this unique time. It will carry much more weight then what they did during these weeks/months. Enjoy your family time!
