We are three quarters through the school year and the weather is warming back up. Staying hydrated and protecting ourselves from the sun are a must here in Florida.

Please help keep your student hydrated and healthy by making sure to send in a water bottle every day. A refillable bottle is perfect, there are fountains available in the hallways for refills as needed throughout the day. If your student needs a bottle, we some available in the clinic that were generously donated by Carroll & Sutton Orthodontics. Thank you, Carroll & Sutton Orthodontics! Please let your student know they can stop by and pick one up before class starts in the morning.

The UV rate is also increasing, sun burn hurts and can be prevented. You can help prevent sunburn on your child by helping them apply sunscreen when outdoors for more than 15 minutes. Also, encourage them to wear protective clothing such as long sleeve swim suits and hats. Did you know that eyes can also get damaged by the sun? Wearing sunglasses that have UV protection can help prevent that sun damage. When the UV is higher than 6 it is best to seek shade between 10am and 4pm.
