Dear Parents and Guardians,

Several years ago, our school was able to generate funds, on average of \$80k a year, through our aftercare program. Our aftercare income became a District revenue leaving schools needing to go to fundraisers in order to continue to generate site-based funding. Williams does still receive a small amount aftercare money, approximately \$5k a year. Since this change, we have had to increase the number of fundraisers conducted as a school. Thanks to our generous parents, community members, and business partners, our students, teachers, and staff have benefited from the results of these successful fundraisers. For example, over the last five years, more than 80% of our staff have attended research-based professional development training in cooperative structures to increase student engagement; 100% have had state-of-the-art Promethean boards installed in their classrooms to impact student engagement; 100% have been supported with research-based curricular resources for students, such as classroom libraries and enrichment-based materials and curriculum resources, such as Acaletics, a math curriculum resources. Additionally, students have enjoyed new recess equipment, PE equipment, spirit wear, books, and multiple celebrations for positive reinforcement of grades and behavior. These are just a few of the things we can do as a school, thanks in large part, to the fundraising dollars raised each year in partnership with YOU!

Williams Elementary hosts five major fundraisers a year. Two are hosted by the school and three are hosted by the PTO. Please mark your calendars for our 2019 – 2020 fundraisers.

Our fundraising efforts for the 19 – 20 school year will focus on raising money for continued professional development for staff as needed, student incentives, teacher and staff incentives and supplies, curriculum resources to support student achievement, such as IXL, Acaletics, and SRA and technology—namely a new, electronic (LED) sign for our school, teacher tablets for instruction and up to five student tablets per class to be used in small group instruction.
