Welcome to Fall!

I would like to thank the FBI (Father's Being Involved) for putting up four tetherball courts on the playground. Our students are very excited to use them each day at recess. We also need to thank the parents and students that came out on Saturday, October 5 to clean up the campus. They removed bricks for construction. We were able to take down the orange temporary fencing that has been up for almost one year. Finally, we had a few dads that were able to pressure wash the sides of several buildings. This was a huge task and the results are awesome. Lenny was able to get many of the buildings completed this summer. We are now very close to having all sides clean.

Construction Update:

The school board held a workshop on Tuesday, October 9 to review our construction plan. The budget of \$20.4 million does not cover all of the needs on the construction plans. Jane Dreger from Construction Services for the district along with the architect and construction manager shared that we will need an additional \$3 million to complete the plans for all buildings.

At the meeting it was shared that a total budget of \$23.4 million is very close to the cost of Barbara Harvey (the new elementary school). The board is going to contact the state to request that we would be allowed to tear down the school and rebuild a new school rather than remodel.

If approved, a plan would move forward with moving the students and staff off our campus to another location. We would be there for 12-15 months while they tear down and rebuild Witt Elementary.

If not approved, the school board would consider our request for the additional \$3 million and begin work on the new 8 classroom wing and then complete a phase of work to complete all other buildings.

Chairman Miner asked for a three week pause to allow time to see if this is feasible.

I am excited to announce that we now have Peer Mediation at Gene Witt Elementary School! We have 9 students from 4th and 5th grade who have completed a four-week training. The goal of this program is for students to work together in order to resolve conflict. Students who are having an argument, disagreement, or other type of conflict with a classmate may choose to participate in peer mediation or they may be referred by a faculty member. The Peer Mediators, working in teams of two, listen to both sides of the story and work to help the students peacefully and logically resolve their issues. Everyone has a chance to state their case and work towards a logical resolution of the problem. Students learn valuable lessons by participating in this process such as teamwork, listening and communication skills, empathy, respect, and problem-solving skills. This is truly a "kids helping kids" program.
