- 3) Approval of Minutes (Krystal Sullivan): 6:16 p.m.
  - D. Berger made motion to approve April SAC minutes, seconded by C. Auckerman, motioned was carried.
- 4) SAC Secretary Nomination (Carl Auckerman/ Krystal Sullivan): 6:19 p.m.
  - K. Toomey was nominated by C. Auckerman and R. Lansky seconded the motion. Motion was approved.
- 5) SAC Bylaw Review (Matthew Whelden): 6:20 p.m.
  - Review of BRHS SAC bylaws posted on school website and approved 4/5/21
- 6) School Improvement Plan (SIP) \*SAC Approval (Matthew Whelden): 6:22 p.m.
  - SIP plan for 2021-2022 school year focuses on maximizing academic programs and resources such as Schoology and mentoring/tutoring sessions.
  - Q (K. Sullivan): Did the school find out if SAC will receive any SIP funding this year?
    - A: Not at this time.
  - SIP plan will be presented to the SAC committee in October; which will be followed by district approval.
  - Q (K. Sullivan): Is everyone a voting member or will there only be certain members who can vote?
    - A: For tonight, everyone will be a voting member. All demographics/populations will need to be represented at the meeting.
- 7) Code of Conduct Update (Carl Auckerman): 6:27 p.m.
  - Code of conduct is reviewed and revised every year by the district and approved by the school board.
  - Conflict with school policy at BRHS with the student handbook compared to district code of conduct: Hair color and piercings.
  - Hair color has been completely removed from district code of conduct.

- We cannot be in opposition of student of code of conduct from the district without losing district support.
- Piercings are still in the code of conduct, but wording has changed. The code of conduct states no piercings that can be a safety risk or class disruption can be visible during school.
- Most cases at BRHS have been counseled and warned by the deans and handled on a case by case bases.
- Braden River is still the same orderly, consistent, and caring atmosphere.
- Q (K. Sullivan): If we have a handbook that we have approved as parents, and the district's code of conduct doesn't support ours, then what's the point of having our own student's handbook?

A: The school will have to address it with the district if challenged and hopefully get clarification within the next few weeks regarding specific policy.

## 8) Covid Update (Carl Auckerman): 6:41 p.m.

- The positivity rate in Manatee County is currently at 18% and the threshold alarm is around 8%.
- The school has added extra seating outside for lunch to help spread out students, hand sanitizer is all over campus, cleaning classrooms daily is ongoing, district has imposed a mask mandate until October 29<sup>th</sup> with an optout process.
- Out of 1,800 students, 450 have formally opted out. More than 450 students are not wearing masks; therefore, forms were sent home with students in first period Monday, August 30<sup>th</sup> for anyone who wants to opt out, and there is option for parents to opt out on the FOCUS Parent Portal.
- Q (D. Jarquin): How are you distinguishing between who opted out and who didn't?
  - A: We have to carefully ask if students they opted out of wearing a mask. The governor's order does not allow students to be questioned or bullied about wearing a mask, therefore it is a work in progress to determine who is opted out and who is not.
  - Q (G. Ramirez): Will teachers be allowed to enforce it? Do you have to wear a mask at sporting events?

A: The teachers can look in FOCUS to see if the student is opted out and offer them a mask. Sporting events are mask-optional.

A (K. Sullivan): If a parent comes to campus to fill out a form will it be automatically put in FOCUS?

Q: Yes, as fast as someone can input them is when they will be in FOCUS.

## 9) Open Agenda: 6:48p.m.
