Purpose:

SAC's purpose is to *advance quality education opportunities* for all students, to foster school/community partnerships and to assist the school principal in the overall function of the school.

Functions:

- **Facilitate *communication* among school, parents and community**
- **Inform and *advise school staff* of community conditions**
- ***Define problems* or issues affecting education**
- **Participate in the *decision-making process***

Membership:

- **Comprised of parents, students, teachers and others from the community**
- **SAC will endeavor to ensure membership is representative of the ethnic, racial and economic community served by the school**
- **Have at least one member who does not have children at the school**

Officers & Elections:

- Officers of SAC – Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson & Secretary
- Nominations & Election process starts in March/April of each school year

Responsibilities of SAC Membership:

- To be present & participate at SAC Meetings
- Serve as a *representative of the School Community*
- Participate in activities aimed at obtaining *parent and community support*
- Assist in obtaining *community resources* to aid the school's educational programs


Meetings:

- Eligible Voting Members must have attended at least one prior SAC meeting
- Quorum – majority of the Eligible Voting Members present at a regular meeting shall constitute a Quorum
- Decisions – all decisions of the SAC require an affirmative vote of the majority of Eligible Voting Members
