- I. Welcome and Approval of Minutes- Mr. Little
Mrs. Giannone called the meeting to order, and Mr. Hall motioned to approve the minutes, and Mrs. Lovine seconded the motion. Everyone voted yes, and the motion was approved.

- II. New Business
 - a. Vote on A+ Money
The money received from being an “A” school is being voted on, and the SAC must approve the plan or make changes. The deadline is February 1st. Mrs. Giannone entertained a motion, Mr. Shafer moved to approve the motion, and Mrs. Hoskinson seconded it. The motion was approved.
 - b. Facilities Update-Galindo
The auditorium is almost complete, and the only thing left to do is to mount the projector. Portable remediation has been occurring, and nine have been remediated. Currently, they are 3 weeks behind and it takes 6 days for 2 portables. The overall quality of the work being done is well, while the portables are still old, once remediation is complete the portables are very clean. There are 23 portables on campus, and vacant portables were remediated first so teachers and classes have been relocated while their portable is being remediated. New carpet is being installed in the band room, and Mr. Lambert is choosing a color. Custodians are 2/3 of the way done through wipe downs and clean ups of ventilations outside of building 4. Progress is being made, but the job is still not done. Mr. Little followed up on the storage portables, and the floor was redone, and the mold that was believed to be in the closet of the tech room of the auditorium has been cleaned up. Mr. Shafer asked about having new carpet in all the rooms in building 4, and Mr. Little said it would depend on what is in stock downtown. The track is almost ready to be rubberized,

and we are still waiting for it to finish curing. The project completion date is in March.

c. 1Mill4Manatee Referendum –Little

There will be a vote on March 20th, and if it passes, \$33 million dollars will be brought into the district each year. The use of this is for the people, not buildings. Teachers and staff will receive the biggest portion of the \$33 million so we can recruit and retain the best people. An additional 30 minutes will be added onto the school day, similar to schools in Sarasota and neighboring counties. The money will also bring into technology to STEM and CTE programs as well. The allocation breakdown is \$18.7 million (56%) goes to teachers/paraprofessionals, School Support Staff/Hourly receives \$2.6 million (8%), Stem/Career and Technical receives \$5.1 million (15.5%), School Administrators/Samp at Schools will receive \$1.8 million (6%), and Charter Schools will receive \$4.8 million (14.5%). Voting occurs in March because holding off until October will cause us to not receive \$33 million for the 2018-19 school year. The half-penny sales tax goes to buildings and technology. One million goes to the people working.

d. Mini Grant Order Update-Staker

Between September and December 13 Mini Grants were approved and it added up to \$10,567. Three applicants have not been presented to the bookkeeper. Six incorrect applications need to be finalized in order for them to be filled, and the majority of the grants have not yet been filled.

III. Principal Update

Mr. Little wished everyone a happy new year, and the process for the 2018-19 school year registration has began, and they are still working on the online registration. Registration will also occur for eighth graders online, but it has not been decided which middle schools they will test it on yet. Schoology is a learning management system, and learning can take place in a blended environment. The program is meant for teaching and learning to take place, and it is meant to infuse that and technology together. It provides a virtual online classroom that subsidizes face to face experience. Resources will be accessible on the platform, and it was just introduced this school year, and some teachers have jumped in, while others have not. Teachers must meet the January 31st deadline to initiate and manipulate the system. Further phases of the project are on the way, but later there will be communication between schoology and focus. Focus will remain the gradebook of record, because it communicates between the district and the state. As schoology becomes more integrated, the need for more technology will become greater. There will be parent access to schoology, but on certain levels. In January, mentor groups will work with Seniors who have less than 19 credits in order to get the ready to graduate in May. There are other programs available for Seniors to do credit recovery.

IV. Student Update

Girls soccer is currently 8-4-3 and are 2nd in districts, and senior night is this Thursday, January 18th. Boys soccer is undefeated, and their senior night is next Wednesday. Boys basketball is 8-3, and on Friday the team will face Braden River. Girls basketball is 9-4, and they play Manatee tonight. There was an Open House on January 11th for the incoming 9th graders to explore the campus and programs offered at Lakewood Ranch and a Dance Marathon is being planned on January 27th. NHS Induction process is underway, and SGA is currently planning a dodgeball tournament within the student body and the money raised by the tournament will be donated to F.E.L.T.S. (Feeding Empty Little Tummies), Faculty Awards Night, and they will begin implementing the SAI (Students Above the Influence) program soon.
