- I. Welcome and Approval of Minutes- Mr. Little
Mr. Staker entertained to begin the meeting at 7:02 pm. Mr. Galeziowski motioned to approve the minutes, and Mr. Mendel seconded the motion. Everyone voted yes, and the motion was approved.

- II. New Business
 - a. Next Years Bell Schedule-Little
With the passing of the millage, there will be thirty minutes added onto the school year next year. Where the thirty minutes will be added to is undecided. It is also undecided as well if the school will remain on the block schedule, or return to a skinny schedule. It is required to have three lunch periods, and it would be helpful to add time between each lunch to help the cafeteria staff clean up. Mr. Galeziowski asked who decides the schedule for the school, and Mr. Staker said that it is up to the school to decide what is best for the school. Mr. Mendel said that the block schedule makes sense, and it would be beneficial to stick to block scheduling. Mr. Galeziowski suggested having a study hall period as well. Mr. Little said that if any major change is done to bell schedule, the principal has to put together committees that each represent a department. He said that advanced classes, science classes, and math classes benefit from having a block period. Mr. Little also said by the next board meeting it should be decided where the thirty minutes will be added to. By the next SAC meeting there will be more information available on the additional time.
 - b. Senior Information-Little
Mr. Little reviewed the sheet that Mrs. Fleury handed out to seniors. May 1st is senior awards night, and May 3rd is the senior dinner. Cap and Gown pick up is May 17th, and graduation practice is May 18th at 8:00 am, and actual graduation is on May 18th at 7:00 pm. Any information regarding

c. Mini Grant Update-Staker

There were thirteen mini grants granted at the beginning of the year, and eight teachers have used their grants, and not everyone have received their order yet. Two grants had to be re-submitted due to incorrect paper work. Over the course of the school year, \$11,117 has been spent, and around \$500 is left over. After the mini grant meeting, no other teachers have asked about mini grants. Mr. Staker asked the members to send him emails with possible ideas for the money. Mr. Galeziowski asked what the money could go to, and Mr. Little said it has to apply to the school improvement plan, which is broad and this allows the money to be used in many different ways.

III. Principal Update

Mr. Little said that the numbers for next year is around the same numbers as this year, as the rezoning did not alleviate as much as previously expected. Students living in Greyhawk and Mill Creek will remain attending Lakewood Ranch. There are now two SRO officers on campus, and they have been going around and checking to make sure teacher's doors are locked. More fencing has been put around portables, and the doors into the main entrance of the school are kept locked, and the attendance office workers unlock the door for everyone going in and out of campus. There was a lockdown drill before spring break, and Mr. Little and Mr. Staker went through instructions step by step for what would happen if there was an active shooter on campus in different scenarios and situations. Anticipated openings in math and ESE are open, and it is difficult to find good teachers to fill those positions. The hiring process works inside out. It has been told that the chillers will be on 24/7, and it is no longer needed to request to turn on the air for events after school or on the weekend.

IV. Student Update

On March 12th, the SGA held the dodgeball tournament and raised \$650 that will be donated to the charity Feeding Empty Little Tummies (F.E.L.T.). Last Friday, April 13th was prom, and the theme was a Venetian Evening. The prom king and queen were Matthew Dugan and Kailey Carpenter. The NHS induction for new members is Friday, April 20th, and there will be a dinner and ceremony held for the new inductees. The SGA also has their Faculty Awards Night coming up on the 26th. They are currently working on the script and skits for the show. The event will be catered by Texas Roadhouse. It also gives SGA the opportunity to award the teachers for all their hard work throughout the school year. Softball has their senior night tonight and they are 4th in the state currently. Baseball has a game tonight and is having a successful season as well. Track and field is doing well, and brought home fourth and first place titles. Girls flag football is in first place for the south, and will be facing the north team soon. Girls and boys lacrosse completed their first season. There is also a spring football game on May 11th.
