The title I School SAC PTO meeting met at the school at 6:00 P.M. Everyone signed the sign in sheet. Mrs. Soto welcomed everyone and translated for our Spanish families.

Mrs. Gremley talked about our "100 Men in Suits" program. It is a new program we have this year. It is men volunteering to our students, volunteers, our men faculty, etc. We have found out that men in children's lives do better. We had our first event - men worked with students, sat in cafeteria with them, etc. We are going to do an event a month. January will be a field day outside. We will have an event in Feb. before the Super Bowl.

Mrs. Hoagland talked about bullying. We have a speaker come in every year to talk about bullying, to 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders, the teachers, and workers talk to the younger ones. Bullying is when someone threatens, hurts you on purpose, to take control, they have all of the power. Fighting has a balance of power. Students need to stand up for themselves and bullying needs to be reported to someone. Mrs. Hoagland will answer any questions anytime.

Mrs. Delb talked about the after school remediation program. It is going to be different this year. There will be clubs for students, Math, reading, science, art, music, etc. We will have another program in January for only ELL students. The program is by invitation only, but parents can apply. This program starts Monday.

It is for 12 to 15 weeks. It goes from 3:15 to 5:15 p.m.

She also talked about the AR and million reading program. Grades 1 and 2 should read 20 min. Older children should read 30 minutes. When they read a book they will take an AR test on it. There were encouraged to have parent involvement. It is to better understand what they read. There will be prizes for both, Prizes and class parties with a big party at the end of school.

The fund raisers are for help with things the school needs for classrooms, etc. This one goes from Oct 30 to Nov. 15th.

We will have a Lap top for the top parent at end of year for volunteer work. Parents can put in whatever time they want. They must sign in and out at office. They can work in classrooms, cafeteria, etc.

We will have a parent resource center starting Nov. 16th, grand opening. There will be lap tops for parents to use for paying bills, making doctor appointments, applying for Medicaid and food stamps, etc. It will be open Mon. Tues, Wed. 9:00-11:00 A.M. There will be a sign in and out sheet.

We had comments from parents. Mrs. Houston explained that the purpose of our fence is to keep our students safe. Parents need to come into the office. It is the same at all schools, only students can enter at certain places unless you have a key.

Miss Borden is interested in being the new chair person. She was not at the meeting tonight, so we will check out to see if she is still interested. Mrs. Sailer will be vice-chair person. She would handle things if chair person was not there.

5 essential parent survey. Notices were sent home with all students for the parents to go on the computer to take the survey. Parents can go to the parent resource room tomorrow from 9:00 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. to take the survey. Breakfast will be served. Also they can take the survey next Mon., Tues, Wed. We need 200 families to take the survey.

FSA testing dates: reading, writing, math, and science,

Writing 4th and 5th - March 1st.

3rd - reading, math - last week in March, when we come back from break.

4th grade - 1st week in April, 5th grade - 2nd week in April. Some things are on the computer for the larger grades. 5th grade is the only one taking science.

ELL has tests.

Million reading Challenge. This is to get

them to read at home. They are to fill out reading logs. We have 340 thousand minutes so far. The better they read the better they will do on the tests. Children get to read 15 minutes here to read on their logs.

Mustang Club tutoring this is to bring them to meet the standards.

The program will run until the end of March, Tues & Thurs. The Mustang Club will finish the same date.

It was suggested from Parents that children read more on week ends.

Next S.A.C. meeting is scheduled for May 5, 2006, but the date can be changed due to Conrado miss. Third grade is the year the student can be retained. If they fail the test they can take a part failure test, if not that go to summer school. If they don't pass that they will be retained. They have three chances. Parents are encouraged to talk to teachers. Progress reports go out next week.
