Student Course Registration: Registration has started! Students were getting recommendations, filling out papers, getting applications.

Worked with USF to stream line the process for this year's registration. Several road blocks have been overcome in the transition process.

- **USF & SCF** Dual Enrollment and MTC- strict deadlines and applications for Dual enrollment classes. To-Do lists will be emailed to the student and parent because of the rigor. USF Sarasota course on the campus - up to three but will be encouraged to take them here at BRHS. Course through SCF will be online and offered either in the computer lab or at home. **MTC-** application is required and there are testing requirements. 22 different programs are offered with different requirements. Students need to understand that they may miss some of the "high school" experiences at the high school. Students need to think at what works for them and fits in their long-term goals.
Meetings will be held at school for students that plan to take dual enrollment classes. Any students that have already enrolled in dual enrollment have an easy process if taking classes on campus.
- AP Capstone Diploma - slated for seniors next year that take the research course.

Personal Trainer course will be offered and hopefully filled for next year.
